A few years back the Lutheran Witness featured an article about a missionary family far from home on Christmas morning. It came time for the Christmas Morning Church Service and there was nobody at the church except the Pastor's family. What to do?

There would be no choirs, and no large family gathering.

Was it time to be disappointed and sad on Christmas morning?

The Christmas meal would be very modest.

There was no snow and there had been no Christmas carolers.

Would it even feel like Christmas?

The author writes that on that morning, so far from home, as they started their worship, she was

overwhelmed by the full meaning of Christmas.

The very first Christmas was celebrated far from home, in a cattle stall.

The Christmas caroling was done out in the fields among sheep, not in town and not heard by Mary or Joseph.

The sermon was preached by shepherds, straight out of the fields.

The smell wafting through the air was not sweet potatoes, or turkey, or the smell of a Christmas tree but . . . well, the smells that go with cattle and sheep and goats.

But that was the first Christmas and it was the best Christmas.

That first and best Christmas has changed the world. God has come to live among us. He came to be with us as a child, to grow up, to laugh and play, to share our joys and sorrows – and then one day to would go to a cross and on that cross to earn, win and give us eternal life.

That is what Christmas is all about, the work of God, begun in Bethlehem, finished on Calvary and revealed on Easter morning.

Christmas is what God has done -

And because He has done it nothing can change it. Nothing can replace it. And nothing can improve it. The birth of Jesus into our world is a gift we celebrate wherever we are. And the whole world is changed because of what God has done. Jesus is born – and we are re-born as children of heaven.

So it is Christmas – in the small towns of America as our families gather.

It is Christmas in our big cities teeming with both wealth and poverty.

It is Christmas far from home where missionaries celebrate alone, and share the good news of Jesus.

It is Christmas on the battlefields of Afghanistan, because Jesus the Savior brings the only true peace to a war torn world.

Christmas opens up into this world in a cattle stall in Bethlehem with a young mother hushed and reverent and a newborn baby, with shepherds and noises and smells. That image from 2,000 years ago still takes control of the season and quiets us and calls us to God.

This Christmas season look long and deeply at the heart of the season.

In your soul gaze on the Christ Child and think about how you have been blessed.

When you hear the Christmas carols think about the shepherds startled by the angels.

When you shop for presents, think about the wise men, journeying for months to see the greatest present of all - the baby Jesus.

When you decorate for Christmas, think about God the Father decorating the sky with stars and the earth with amazing beauty to prepare for His Son to come into the world.

And when it is time to come to church, think about the shepherds saying "Let us go to Bethlehem then and see this thing that has happened."

And then when it comes time to open presents, think about Jesus who gave Himself for you.

The angel said, "Today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior who is Christ the Lord."


We're going to take a break from meeting during the winter months and we'll pick up where we left off in the spring!
