"THE LOVE OF CHRIST COMPELS US"

It's February, the month for valentines, hearts, candy - and some talk about love. But this phrase from Paul, "The love of Christ compels us." (2 Corinthians 5:14) What exactly does that mean?

There are many ways to compel - by law, by force, by fear and intimidation. How can and does love compel? When you are compelled by law, force, or intimidation it is in order to avoid something unpleasant. Do not drive over the speed limit through that one town; if you do someone may be waiting to give you a ticket. Get up in the morning and go to school, it is not a choice. Be careful rooting for "the other team." (Well that one doesn't always work.) But still, an outward compulsion effects our outward behavior.

Love reaches far deeper. The love of a mother, a husband, or a wife can compel us in ways that are far stronger. Love doesn't only deal with outward actions. It reaches within and we are moved. Being loved we respond. A young bride will spend hours preparing a special meal thinking of her husband's smile. A young husband will take out the garbage, fix the car, clean the basement (sometimes even do dishes) simply because his wife will appreciate it. We know what it is to be moved by love.

Even on the battlefield love is the deepest motivation. It touches our inner being, our beliefs, and our emotions; and it soldiers to

do heroic things. It is on that level God deals with us in Christ. Let's spell it out.

First we are called to look to Christ and know that we are loved. The verses before John 3:16 say, "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness so must the Son of Man be lifted up that all who believe may in Him have eternal life." Jesus is lifted up on the cross, raised up before the world so that all may know what God has done to take away our sins. We are loved. This year we have a coincidence (a coming together) when Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday (and Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day). So we will begin our Lenten journey talking about love. It is the one love that is the source of all love. And then the whole Lenten season will lead us step by step to the cross to look into the depths of the love of God in Christ. It is God's will that His love for us in Jesus should be held up for all to see.

Looking to Jesus in faith we are changed. The New Testament calls it a new birth. In the Old Testament (Ezekiel 36) God says He will remove our heart of stone and give us a heart of flesh so that we can respond to Him.

God brings us into His family through faith – a faith He creates in our souls. By faith we live every moment in a relationship with Jesus. He is our constant companion. Each and every day of our lives the love of Christ is a force in our lives. He works on us and inside us even when we are resisting and working hard to go the other way. As we grow in faith the love of Jesus works into more and more parts of our life. Our words, our actions, our ways of thinking are changed. This is what Jesus does.

We talk in the Catechism about daily drowning in baptism and about the new man who is to "daily come forth and arise, to live before God in righteousness and purity forever." As Lutherans we talk about "the Means of Grace" or "the Word and Sacraments" in our walk with God. These are what God holds out to us and what He uses to draw close to us and draw us close to Him. The Bible, our baptism and the Lord's Supper weave through our whole life. They guide our outward acts and our inward life of the soul. Deep inside we know how God is calling us to a constant knowledge of His presence in and with us.

So now what? As we grow in knowing the love of Jesus something happens. It is the same as what happened to Paul. After he came to know Jesus he had to tell others. Right at first there was a burst of evangelism. Then very gradually (over a period of 17 years) he was prepared by God for the great missionary journeys of the book of Acts. It is this Paul who said, "the love of Christ compels us." He knew what he was talking about.

At Friends in Christ we come together as a congregation. We worship together. We pray for each other. We search out God's will for the future. And God promises to bless.

We have seen His blessing and provision. It has come in some ways we did not expect. Others we looked for and prayed for. But it is always God who is leading and God who is in charge. Later this spring we will have opportunity to share with a lot of people about the KYKS program telling how we give shoes to children returning to school every fall. (The Lutheran Women's Missionary League Spring Rally is April 14 in Yorkville.)

Week after week we reach out to everyone we can to tell the good news about Jesus and how sweet it is to know the Savior who loves us and forgives our sins. Our relationships with others in missions continue to grow. Even financially we are growing and doing better each year. We have walked with God and we know that the Lord is good. The joy of being Christians shows in our worship.

God has been preparing us to reach out with the love of Jesus. It's what He does. This is the direction, the plan, and the pattern in our lives. So share the love of Jesus. Seek ways and opportunities. Share Jesus' love in your words and in your actions; by yourself and with others. You will find a joy that grows and keeps on growing.


