## 20-20 A YEAR FOR SEEING CLEARLY

### Part 5: Interesting Times

**Many years ago**, when I was young, I heard the following:

There's an old Chinese curse, "May you live in interesting times!"

Being young, I thought, "How's that a curse?" And then some years passed, and I thought, "Oh! Now I get it!"

### We are living in interesting times.

Last month, at the end of the article I posted, "Next Month 20-20 – I have no idea what's coming in even a month". Actually, I have no idea what's coming in even a week. The day starts, and who knows what the earth-shaking headline is going to be by the end of the day?

These are "Interesting Times." Things are constantly changing, and we are not sure what it will all mean. And then by the time we have started to figure it out, everything changes again. reading or put it down because they did not want to read the ending? Some day, when the right authors come along, they will write some amazing books.

And I have to ask: Do you miss those boring predictable days of way back 7 weeks ago?

### **Speaking of a page-turner:**

There was another kind of “Interesting Time” years ago. Things happened very quickly, and those who lived through it could not keep up with the twists and turns, the ups and downs. As soon as they got their minds around what had just happened, it all changed all over again. It turned out well in the end, but in the middle almost nobody had any idea what was next.

Jesus rode into town; and the whole city turned out, cheering and celebrating. It was the most amazing thing! And He came riding in on a donkey, just like one of the great kings of early days. The disciples had seen Him avoid the crowd that wanted to make Him king. What was going on?

And then, He went into the temple and overturned tables and drove out the money-changers. He said they were making it a den of thieves. The people loved it; but Jesus was making enemies. What was His plan? The Pharisees, Sadducees and Lawyers tried to debate Him and catch Him in trick questions. But they came away embarrassed. Everything was coming together. Our confusion is okay. That’s what it is to have God in charge and have to live by faith.

But in the middle of everything happening, there is one thing solid, unchanging, and steady. Jesus is the same. He is the Savior. He is the one who carried the cross, took our punishment, faced our death and claimed the victory – for us. Everything for us.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! And He is Still Risen Indeed! – after almost 2,000 years. He will Still be Risen Indeed! – through all eternity. As long as Jesus lives we can smile at the days. They are the scenery and events along the way in an eternal journey with the living God. We know that we will win, and rise, and be glorious; because Jesus has won the victory.

He will return and He will share His victory with us. And that will be the “Most Interesting Time of all the Interesting Times” ever.

### Mission Grant Story • April 2020

#### WIND RIVER INDIAN RESERVATION TRANSPORTATION Fort Washakie, Wyoming — \$40,000

With the purchase of a church building near Fort Washakie in the spring of 1978 by the LCMS Wyoming District, the mission work with the Shoshone and Arapaho Native American tribes began. A large part of this ministry is focused on outreach to the children of the Wind River Indian Reservation. Due to the distance from their homes and with transportation options being limited, very few children are able to attend the Bible classes in Fort Washakie and Crowheart. A suitable vehicle will enable the children to continue the 88-mile round trip to Fort Washakie to Sunday school and the 60-mile round trip to Crowheart for the "Monday" school. These classes are the mission's best, and in most instances, the only, opportunity to share the Gospel of Christ with the children living on the Reservation.

The children of this high-poverty ethnic area receive few or no opportunities for Christian education. Often, there is little involvement from the parents in their children's education,

and they make no effort to attend church. However, the parents grant the Wind River Lutheran Mission (WRLM) staff permission to pick up their children and take them to Sunday school or VBS. There they learn about Jesus, and the children become Christ-bearers, shining their light and pointing their families to the Savior.

In order to accomplish this work, funds are needed to purchase a reliable passenger van for the children's transportation. A van, rather than a school bus, is preferred, as van drivers are not required to obtain a special license. Your support of Mission Grant #9, the Wind River Indian Reservation Transportation at Fort Washakie, Wyoming, is greatly appreciated.

### Mission Grant Story • May 2020

#### TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH TRANSPORTATION Mobile, Alabama — \$58,000

***As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace (1 Peter 4:10).***

Trinity Lutheran Church of Mobile, Alabama, and their pastor, Rev. Dr. Ulmer Marshall, have a genuine heart for the people in their community. They seek many and diverse ways to connect and serve those who are often under-served and overlooked. As Rev. Marshall has shared with his congregation, "A church is in a community to serve that community. It's our job."

The school of Trinity Lutheran is the last remaining school begun through Rosa Young's ministry located in Mobile, Alabama. With prayer, patience, and its Christ-centered purpose, Trinity Lutheran School serves 200 students from infants through fifth graders. All the students qualify for free lunches, and many receive tuition assistance. Its after school program and Good News Bible Club reaches an additional 45 students.

Trinity Lutheran has remained a stronghold of Christ-centered education in a community dealing with inter-generational poverty and the challenges of urban living by "promoting Christian faith and life-long learning of the whole child in a changing world." Most parents of the children at Trinity are single moms under age 30, who are un- or under-employed, and live in substandard housing.

Because Trinity Lutheran Church is serving the most vulnerable people in their community, this ministry is committed to providing assistance to meet some of the physical needs as well as the spiritual needs of those in the area. The Ministry in Motion at Trinity in Mobile, Alabama grant funds will enable Trinity to purchase a sturdy, handicapped accessible, and well-built church bus for elders, school children, neighbors, and church members to participate in church and school ministries both on and off campus.

# SENIOR SERVICE



We miss our Seniors!!
