

34"For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?"


35 "Or who has given a gift to him that he might be repaid?"


Matthew 16:13-20

Holy Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the sixteenth chapter.
- Glory to You, O Lord.

13Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" <sup>14</sup>And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." <sup>15</sup>He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" <sup>16</sup>Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." <sup>17</sup>And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! 
