Remembering Our Baptism

- **P** I am crucified with Christ, nevertheless I live;
- c yet not I but Christ lives in me:
- **P** and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God,
- **Who loved me, and gave Himself for me.** (Galatians 2:20)
- P Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? (Romans 6:3)
- We were therefore buried with Christ through Baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from death through the glory of the Father, we too may walk in newness of life. (Romans 6:4)
- **P** I ask you anew:

Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?


- **C** I do renounce them.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Father Almighty?
- Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?
- Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell.

 The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- **P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life + everlasting. Amen.
- **P** Do you intend to continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread and in prayer; to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?
- **C** I do, by the grace of God.
- P Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?
- I do, by the grace of God.
- P Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His grace to life everlasting.
- C Amen.
- **P** Let us pray.

Lord God, heavenly Father, we thank and praise You for Your great goodness in bringing us to the knowledge of Your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ, enabling us with the heart to believe and with the mouth to confess His saving name. Epistle: Romans 6:1-11

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Holy Gospel: Mark 1:4-11

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

⁴John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "*You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.*"

Confession of Faith

- **P** What is Baptism?
- Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.
- **P** Which is that word of God?
- Christ, our Lord, says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

 (Matthew 28:19)
- **P** What does Baptism give or profit?
- It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.
- Which are these words and promises of God?
- Christ, our Lord, says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16)
- P How can water do such great things?
- Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water.

For without God's Word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a bath of the new birth in the Holy Spirit,

- **P** What does such baptizing with water teach?
- It teaches that the Old Adam in us should, by daily contrition and repentance, be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and, again, a new man should daily emerge and arise, to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.
- **P** Where is this written?
- St. Paul writes, in Romans, chapter six:

"We were therefore buried with Him through Baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4)


