THE BEGINNING OF VALENTINE'S DAY

In the middle of this month comes a day observed all over the world as a day of love and romance. How did this happen?

- 1. First it is not Valentine's Day but St. Valentine's Day. There is some history. It has to do with a Christian named Valentine or Valentinus. There are several stories and we are not sure about any of them. One of the more interesting says that he was "arrested and imprisoned" for "marrying Christian couples and otherwise aiding Christians". Claudius II "took a liking to [him] until Valentinus tried to convert the Emperor whereupon the priest was condemned to death." (from Wikipedia) Another story has him beheaded in the year 280 under Emperor Claudius; but before he was executed teaching, converting, and healing the daughter of his jailer. Both are stories of selfless love. Where does that come from?
- 2. It is important to know that the Christian understanding of love is not the same as the world's. When we talk about love we are not talking an emotion that makes you swoon or go weak in the knees. We are not talking about passion, lust and desire.

We are talking about what is in the center of our faith. It is a determined love that seeks the best and greatest for the beloved. We are talking about Jesus Christ. All proper and true human experience of love is pulled and tugged back to the cross.

It can't be any other way, because the greatest love is what Jesus said in John 15 "that a man lay down his life for his friends. You are My friends . . ." Every love is measured by its connection to that love. Let's look at several, very different kinds.

THE BEGINNING OF VALENTINE'S DAY (...Con't)

(1) There is the love that a man and woman have for each other, and for the sake of that love they will give to and sacrifice for each other. Luther said that when they are first married they will do anything for each other joyfully and not asking what is in it for self. (2) There is the love a soldier has for his brothers in arms; that reaches so far that he will even die for them. This is the example most closely linked to the cross. (3) There is the love parents have for their children that moves them to sacrifice continually through many years so their children may grow strong and be blessed.

How closely are each connected to the cross? When we give of ourselves for the blessing of others it is because the pattern of the cross is given by God to our lives. When we depart from the pattern of the cross, then what is supposed to be cross-shaped and Christ-focused becomes self-centered.

How deep does this go? How far back?

God gives us His love in Jesus Christ. It is a blessing we experience now. The pattern of the cross fills all of life. But it is a love that goes back before the world was created. Let's trace back step by step:

God called Abraham to know Him and promised the blessing of Jesus Christ would be for every family on earth.

In Genesis 3, after the fall into sin, God promised to send Jesus for their salvation. He said this about Jesus to the devil, "He will crush your head and you will strike His heel." In love Jesus came for us; in love He fought and won the victory for us; in love He was wounded and laid down His life for us; and in love He rose for us.

As the world was being created Jesus was celebrating the work of His Father "rejoicing before Him always, rejoicing in His inhabited world and delighting in the children of man." (Proverbs 8)

Even before the world was created the plan of salvation was in place. Paul talks about "a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glory." (1 Corinthians 2:7) And it goes even deeper than this.

We finally come to the question "Why?" Why has God loved us? Why did God care for us and send Jesus to suffer in our place?

The proper theological answer (the one you will get from the very best professors at the seminary) is: "I don't know." There is something completely inexplicable about the love of God.

Did He love you because you were better than your neighbor? No. Did He love me because I was searching for Him? No. Did God love some instead of others because he saw that they would respond to His love? No.

The love of God comes before anything we could do in responding to Him. In fact the love of God calls us in spite of who we are and what we are like. C. S. Lewis, famous Christian writer describes himself as "being dragged kicking and screaming into the kingdom of God."

How far reaching is all this?

You have been loved by God and it is a love that spans all time. It even goes beyond all time. The love of God actually begins deep within the Trinity. It is what characterizes the relationships between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is eternal.

This love of God then comes into our world, to us and for us. It is a love that bears all things and conquers all things. It is a love that sets the pattern for the whole creation and is the pattern for the future. It is the kingdom of God that is coming and no king or nation is able to stop it. It is a love that is the greatest power and is the gentlest kindness. And "every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

Walking with my Lord





GIMMEL (Part 1)

- ¹⁷ Charitably deal with Your servant, that I may live and observe Your <u>word</u>.
- Clear-sighted make my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of Your <u>law</u>.
- ¹⁹ Cast off; I am a sojourner on the earth; hide not Your <u>commandments</u> from me!
- Consumed is my soul with longing all the time for Your ordinances.

Verses 17-20 "My Hope in a Foreign World"

Everything should be blessing and delight. The heart is reconciled. Sins are forgiven. All is founded and built on the Mighty Acts of God in Jesus. Why must the psalmist cry out? How can it be that God should seem distant? But that is where he finds himself, so much that he calls to God to deal charitably or he will not even survive.

Together with the basic cry there is an added desire woven in – as the psalmist says, "and observe Your word." His life is not simply to continue breathing and having a heartbeat. It is to be connected to God through His word.

Let's go deeper. "Observe Your word" goes beyond hearing the word of God. It works out from believing God's word. It develops even beyond meditating on God's word. It means to look, watch, trust, and see with eyes of faith as God's word works into and changes every part of life, as every bit of history is taken captive by the kingdom and plan of God. And that means not only history in general; it means I see my life being made part of the kingdom and plan of God. The psalmist struggles to see his life in that way; to see by faith. But seeing by faith in that way calls for more faith and a different vision than any of us can bring. "Charitably deal with Your servant!"

We might think of Peter in Matthew 16 suddenly seeing, "You are the Christ," and Jesus saying, "Blessed are you Simon . . . flesh and blood have not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven."

Even more to the point, think of Jesus in the garden. He prays, "Father, if it is possible [and the answer is, "No"]. "Let this cup pass [again, "no"]. "Yet not my will, but Yours." ("Let Me live and see Your word acting, conquering, victorious.") But there is only one way for that to happen and it is the cross. Isaiah 53 says, "Because He poured out His soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors." (v. 12) "Because" of that He will live and observe "Your word." And again, "out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied." (v. 11) In this way Jesus has joined us in our separation, our sojourning – to find us, to meet us and to bring us back by showing us that He knows our cry and makes it His own.

Verse 18 repeats the prayer slightly changed to open it up even more. "Clear-sighted make my eyes." If God does not do this, if the Holy Spirit does not guide and open these things to us, there is no way we can see any of the acts of God, or any of His Word, or grasp any of the revelation (Torah) of God.

(Verses 19-20) This is the only answer we have in our wandering. For all those times we feel cast off (and they are many), or a sojourner (wandering without plan or home), when the word of God seems closed and we call out for a word, a commandment, a revelation – for anything! When we are overtaken with longing and it gets to the point where it seems to be "all the time," there is the Sojourner of God, the Lamb forsaken, the Servant ("Behold My Servant!" ⁽¹⁾) struck down. And He is there to bring the charitable dealing – the GRACE ⁽²⁾ of God with the wonderful "It is finished," and we are connected again!



Prayer:

Lord Jesus, You came to me in my wandering, bearing my burdens and meeting me in the place of separation. When God seems distant and heaven seems closed, remind me of Your sojourning, of Your walk of faith, of Your prayer in the garden, and how You know all that is in

my soul. Help me when I am in the middle of things I do not understand – help me then to lean on You and know that no matter what anything seems or feels like; You are my Lamb forsaken, my companion in my journey every day and every hour.

Amen.

Notes:

The Servant Songs of Isaiah show us Jesus as the suffering Savior. Piece by piece His ministry is revealed through: Isaiah 42:1-9 – the Servant will bring salvation to the world.

Isaiah 42:18-21 – the Servant must walk by faith, not by sight, and so exalt the words and promises of God.

Isaiah 44:1-5 – the Servant brings together all the Old Testament purposes of God and sends His people out as witnesses to the world.

Isaiah 49:1-13 – the Servant, sent first to the people of Israel, has His mission expanded to the whole world.

Isaiah 50:4-9 – the Servant draws His strength from the word of God in order to comfort and encourage, and in order to face the suffering that is involved in bringing us salvation.

Isaiah 52:13-53:12 – the Servant goes to suffering for our forgiveness.

Isaiah 61:1-3 – this is the preaching of the Servant, as preached in the Synagogue at Nazareth, and it describes the results of His ministry.
