

What to do with 2019: “This Too Shall Pass”



Another year draws to a close. We begin 2019 one year closer to the end of the world, the return of Christ and judgment day. The signs of the times are all around us. There are the “beginnings of birth pangs,” famine, war, the love of many growing cold. But more important than anything else, the Gospel is still spreading to the ends of the earth. Millions in different parts of the world are turning to Christ.

“This too shall pass”

Our days and years are filled with times of trial and times of blessing. The year 2018 was filled with both amazing blessings and incredible trials. Our congregation, our town and our families went through times of joy and laughter and times of sorrow and tears.

- About the sorrow and the tears – it is comforting to know that “this too shall pass.” We are in God's hands, so the sorrows are not eternal. Jesus is our Lord, our Savior and our Friend. So there is comfort and there will be joy.
- About the joy and laughter – it is sobering to know that “this too shall pass.” We are not excused from taking up our cross and following. We are marked by Jesus as His followers, so the cross will find its way into our lives. There will be hardships and suffering.
- You can even look in the mirror and say about yourself, “this too shall pass.” Someone said it this way – “even if Judgment Day does not come during

your life, Judgment Day will come for you.” Or, “It is appointed to man once to die and then the judgment.” (Hebrews 9:27)

But, in this world where everything will pass:

Each day and each year is a gift from God. Your days and years are given to you from God; and they are given to you for two reasons.

1. The first is because He is a loving God. He blesses us each and every day with all that we need – life and health, family and friends, food and drink ... and all the good things that give us joy and gladness. All that we enjoy is given to us by a God who is rich in grace and mercy, given in part simply so that we can enjoy His love and learn to thank and praise Him.

That is part of the relationship we have with God because of Jesus. We have been bought, purchased, won, rescued from sin and death, delivered from the devil. What we have now is a joy that the world cannot understand or take away. What we have waiting for us in the future are joys and blessings that last forever.

In the beginning of the Bible it talks about God making the world good. He “saw all the He had made and it was very good.” Simply knowing this helps in finding joy in the days and years that God gives.

Remember to thank God through having joy in the good things He has made. And enjoy the good things of this world in a way that praises God.

2. And then second:

God calls us into a relationship with Him so that we can share in His love. Sharing His love we serve Him by loving our neighbors.

This is a good use of the year 2019. Pray for and look for:
How may I help my neighbor in his time of need?
How may I care for the hungry and the poor?

This is part of our love for God:

Because God created my neighbor in the image of God; and
God loved my neighbor enough that Jesus died and rose for my neighbor.

For 2019 ask, “How may I serve God by caring for my neighbor?” Remember you are sent by Jesus to shine before the world. And there are many in this world who have not heard of or do not know Jesus as their Savior. When Jesus came to His disciples the evening of the first Easter He said, “as the Father has sent Me, I am sending you.” This is for all Christians.

So then, “How do I use 2019?”

Remember that the time is short. 2019 will pass. It's only 365 days long. If you were turning 50 years old this December 31 that means you would have spent 18,262 days in this world.

That's half a century and sounds like a lot. But how many days are there in eternity? It's going to be very, very long.

Eternity is different and there is no “This too shall pass.”

That may be intimidating, so let me remind you of some other things that are eternal. They do not pass.

1. Jesus is Immanuel – God with us. He came to be one of us, permanently.
2. The Bible says about the kingdom of Jesus, “His dominion is an everlasting dominion which shall not pass away, and His kingdom one that shall not be destroyed.” (Daniel 7:14)
3. This is the best one. Jesus cared for us, loved us, and called us His friends; and that is eternal. He is committed.

In what way and with what measure?

“Heaven and earth may pass away but My words will not pass away.”

“I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”

“Because I live, you will live also.”

This is forever. And when Jesus returns we will see Him face to face.

Spend your days of 2019 with joy in knowing the Savior. That's the way we plan to spend eternity.

“We should learn from Christians how to serve humanity” -Dalai Lama

Dharamsala, Dec 25 (IANS): Tibetan spiritual leader the Dalai Lama on Tuesday said the Buddhists should learn from the Christians how to serve the humanity.

Presiding over the second day of his discourse in Bihar's historical city Bodh Gaya, the Dalai Lama urged followers of all religions to form closer contact and learn from each other's traditions.

"The major world religions -- Christianity, Judaism, Islam, different Hindu and Buddhist traditions, Jainism, Daoism, Confucianism, and so on -- each of these has its own unique knowledge that benefits people," he said. "Therefore, through an exchange of knowledge, we can learn new things from each other."

Emphasizing its vital role in the spiritual and inner development, the elderly Buddhist monk said religion has the potential in bringing together people and that "a meaningful exchange could widen and deepen our own spiritual experience".

"Particularly from Christian brothers and sisters, we as Buddhists could learn how to serve the community and engage in social work. I really feel that we should emulate their exemplary social service."


