We are Still Celebrating!

As you read this article feel free to respond out loud at the appropriate times. You already know what the response is! It may have an interesting effect on those who hear you.

It is now about a month since and we are still celebrating. Why? Because Christ is Risen; " . . . "

Actually that's not quite right! It is almost 2,000 years since and we are still celebrating. Why? Because Christ is Risen; "...." ((Hmmm...I wonder if someday we will sing something like I "We've now been here ten thousand years, Bright shining as the sun. We ce-le brate that Christ is Ris'n! Yes He is Ris'n In-deed!" [underlined sung to 2 notes])) This truth endures forever!

It is an interesting thing about truth. And this is so about every day truths as well. We are able to deny them; argue that they are not so; come up with all kinds of excuses why not to listen to them; hire lawyers and PR experts to prove that they are wrong; (and so on); but if it they are truths they seem to just hang around. How old is the saying, "Truth will out." After all our arguments have held the day and persuaded most everybody; after we have listened to every other explanation and made every excuse to do what we wanted to anyway; after we have wandered through every other way of thinking; and after we have exhausted and spent ourselves denying them - truths just keep on being true.

We have the most amazing, comforting and hope-filled truth ever, and we carry it in our hearts and on our lips.

And so the story is told:

It was during the time of the Soviet Union. People were not supposed to believe in God anymore. The state was going to give them everything they needed for every part of life education, jobs, housing, medical care. They were supposed to be content. But

something was wrong. People continued to believe to God. What to do? A commissar was dispatched to one to those troubling towns. He was to go and make the case for atheism. And so he did. The whole town was gathered (you did not dare to refuse in those days). And then he started in, profoundly and eloquently. Point by point, he "disproved" God. He ridiculed Christianity (and all other religions). He mocked the scriptures. He heaped scorn on such things as the miracles of Jesus (the feeding of the 5,000, the healing of the blind man, the changing water into wine, and so on). He mocked the teachings of Jesus (the opiate of the people that caused the masses to accept their shackles and look forward to some - how they say it in English is - "pie in the sky by and by"). He verbally abused the Church and anyone who would be a part of joining in worship. And so it went for a long time. Finally when everyone looked properly beaten down he asked if there were any questions. One humble looking local priest raised his hand. With scorn he said: And what do you have to say?

The priest simply and quietly said three words: Christ is Risen. And the whole crowd

"He is risen indeed!"

And so it goes. Truth is a stubborn thing. The truth we carry is gloriously and wonderfully stubborn!

No matter what the whole rest of the world says or does, this truth remains sure and certain, more solid than anything else in the whole world. It is true on the best days of our lives and in the darkest moments. No matter what happens - in doubt, poverty, sickness and suffering it is true: Christ is Risen; " "

It is true for you when you are struggling against temptation; when you are in doubt and confusion; when you don't know how or what to pray, when you face the uncertainties of the future. Neither death nor life, nor principalities, nor powers, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus, because, Christ is Risen; " "

It is true when you look at times in your life that disappoint and sadden you; or when you look deeply inside your soul and see those things you do not want to see. Jesus really does bring the new beginning, the new life, the new me. He is the only one who can do it because, Christ is Risen; "....."

I suspect that the priest in the story would not have escaped unharmed. In the Soviet Union those who boldly professed their faith were imprisoned and executed. But if he did go to his death he went with the same confession, Christ is Risen; "....."

Around the world Christians face hardships and persecution. There is a tee-shirt that has a cross on the front and says, "This shirt is illegal in 51 countries." But this truth cannot be stopped or kept silent. As Jesus said to the Pharisees, "If these were silent the very stones would cry out." The whole universe resonates with this truth. In fact the whole universe is being reformed and built on this truth so that in the end all creation will sing the praises of Jesus because, Christ is Risen; "....."

In fact we have been told the story of one non-Christian caught up in the persecution, on the

beach in Lybia. He watched his fellow Egyptians being put to death, each given an opportunity to deny Christ and live; each confessing the truth that Jesus is the risen Lord. And then it was his turn. What would he say? We are told that his answer was: "Their God is my God." This is such a powerful truth that it can change eternity even in the final moments of life, this truth that Christ is Risen; "....."

We speak the truth: on Easter morning and throughout the Easter season when we share the greeting Christ is Risen; "....." We use this response at baptisms, because the little children are being brought through death and into eternal life. They share in the truth and the reality and it becomes the most profound truth of their lives that Christ is Risen; "....."

And then at funerals, out at the cemetery where we lay the bodies of our loved ones to rest, once again we speak the truth that Christ is Risen; "....." That place and that time is not a happy one. We are surrounded by death and filled with sorrow. But there and then we speak this truth and we fling it into the face of sin, death and the devil. Do what they want, they cannot change it - Christ is Risen; "....."

We live in Easter. We are the people of the resurrection. We know that when everything is finished we will share in the glory of Easter. We live in confidence. The whole world is changed and we walk in hope. So go with joy. Christ is Risen; "....."

 - 4) Any of our Members who would like to be there.


