Why Thanksgiving?

We are claiming something:

We claim that the blessings we receive are just that -- blessings.

The food on our table is a gift from God who gives good gifts from His good earth. It is personal and not a matter of chance.

Family is a gift from God who brings us together to give and receive care and love for one another. It is not chance or luck that has done it; but God who calls us into relationships. Your mind and soul are gifts from God so that you can live your life knowing the eternal things of God.

They are blessings -- nothing less than gifts, given to you personally from God who created you and knows even the deepest parts of your soul.

Thanksgiving without God, begs the question of who is being thanked; and would be an empty saying, something like, "Thank your lucky stars." But God is there. He knows you personally and cares for you.

This Changes Everything About Thanksgiving

When we pause, pray and give thanks to God, what exactly are we doing? We are claiming a relationship with God. We (Continued on page 2)

claim that He knows us and watches over our every day and hour, every need and blessing. We claim that the food on our tables is more than consuming calories and enjoying the pleasures of tasting and eating and being filled.

We ponder how many things God has put in place, so that the grain can grow, fruits and berries be cultivated, bread, meat and vegetables be gathered for our nurture and blessing? We claim that all these things are done by a Personal God who knows each one of us individually. And when there are struggles and we have a time of need, again we claim that God sees our need and watches over us through everything. It is personal, and that makes all the difference.

"Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread"

About the 4th Petition our Catechism says:

God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

It is personal and it is a part of our relationship with the eternal God.

And that opens up into something amazing.

Daily Bread & Eternal Life:

Luther said that hidden in the words "Give us this day our daily bread" there is the promise of eternal life. How did he find the promise hidden in such simple words?

The words of the Lord's Prayer are the words of God and are eternal. They can never wear out or cease. "He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us."

But for the promise of daily bread to be eternal three things have to be in place:

- (1) God, who faithfully gives the daily bread, eternally, without ceasing;
- (2) Daily bread to be given, and the giving has to also be eternal and without ceasing, and;
- (3) You who believe in and know God through Jesus Christ, have to be there and receive your daily bread.

When the eternal word of God promises something to you forever, you have to be there forever.

When we pray "this day" for this day's "daily bread"; we speak one of the claims of faith. God gives His promises today, and He will be there tomorrow. He will give daily bread tomorrow. And He will be there for all the endless days of eternity. He is my God and He has given eternal promises.

This is why we take time for Thanksgiving. It's a personal thing. As you prepare for Thanksgiving draw close to God and treasure the relationship.

Listening is essential to make any other communication skill work. But there are many things that get in the way. Here are some common stumbling blocks and how they can be avoided.

TOO MANY INFORMATION-GATHERING QUESTIONS

Several information-gathering questions, one right after another, put the questioner in a position of control and place the impetus of the conversation squarely on the questioner.

How to Avoid: Early general questions, such as "Please tell me how you are doing," are invitations to talk about substantive matters the talker wants or needs to discuss.

TELLING A PARALLEL STORY

While this kind of response might seem like an empathic one, especially in the early stages of the conversation it turns the attention from the talker to the listener.

How to Avoid: Place full attention on the experience and context of the talker and seek to understand the talker's experience by focusing on how the talker is feeling.

ADVICE TOO EARLY

Focusing on the first concern and attempting to give advice can stop further exploration into areas that may be more central. Additionally, sometimes people just want to be heard and understood.

How to Avoid: Often neither the presenting issue nor the first statements concerning what is happening are really driving the concern. Attention to underlying or seemingly background concerns is critical.

INATTENTION TO THE ENVIRONMENT

An attentive discussion around other people may not be possible. For instance, in a hospital setting, family members may want to speak for the talker or medical personnel may come in.

How to Avoid: In order for active listening to occur, there need to be conversation boundaries and minimal distractions. Asking for one-on-one time might solve this.

INATTENTION TO YOUR OWN EMOTIONAL AVAILABILITY

The listener might not be in an emotional position to be in listening mode. For instance, if the listener has just had a confrontation with someone else, he or she might be agitated.

How to Avoid: The listener must be aware of his or her own whole-person health before offering care to another. Consider debriefing with a trusted person before meeting with the talker. †
