Stand Nicene Creed **C** I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. 

Prayer of the Church


- P Heavenly Father, we give You thanks and praise today.




Lord's Prayer

 For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.




P Let us pray.
