## Holy Gospel: Mark 6:14-29

Mark 6:14-29

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixth chapter.

**C** **Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>14</sup>King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some said, "*John the Baptist has been raised from the dead. That is why these miraculous powers are at work in him.*" <sup>15</sup>But others said, "*He is Elijah.*" And others said, "*He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.*"

<sup>16</sup>But when Herod heard of it, he said, "*John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.*" <sup>17</sup>For it was Herod who had sent and seized John and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because he had married her.

<sup>18</sup>For John had been saying to Herod, "*It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.*" <sup>19</sup>And Herodias had a grudge against him and wanted to put him to death. But she could not, <sup>20</sup>for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he kept him safe. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed, and yet he heard him gladly.

<sup>21</sup>But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his nobles and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee. <sup>22</sup>For when Herodias's daughter came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests.

And the king said to the girl, "*Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it to you.*" <sup>23</sup>And he vowed to her, "*Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom.*"

<sup>24</sup>And she went out and said to her mother, "*For what should I ask?*"

And she said, "*The head of John the Baptist.*"

<sup>25</sup>And she came in immediately with haste to the king and asked, saying, "*I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.*"

<sup>26</sup>And the king was exceedingly sorry, but because of his oaths and his guests he did not want to break his word to her.

<sup>27</sup>And immediately the king sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison <sup>28</sup>and brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother.

<sup>29</sup>When his disciples heard of it, they came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.
